REGULATIONS AS TO THE TRAINING OF NURSES.

1.—Women will be received at this Hospital and trained as Nurses subject to the following Regulations.

2.—Their age on appointment must not be less than 21, nor more than 35. They must produce satisfactory evidence of moral character, good health, fair education, and general fitness of disposition and temperament for the duties of a Sick Nurse.

3.—They will come on a month's trial, during which time they will not receive either money or uniform. If appointed after a month's trial, they will be required to sign an Agreement to remain in the service of the Infirmary for 2 years, unless allowed to withdraw before the expiration of that time on any special grounds approved by the Committee. They will, however, be subject to dismissal at any time for misconduct, inefficiency, or neglect of duty.

4.—They will be supplied with board, lodging, washing, and uniform. They will receive £10 for the 1st year, £16 for the 2nd year, and £18 for the 3rd year.

5.—A limited number of Probationers will be received without payment. They will receive no salary the 1st year, but will be provided with board, lodging, washing, and uniform, and receive £14 the 2nd year, and £18 the 3rd year.

6.—Pupil Nurses will be received for training for periods of not less than 6 months; to pay £5 a quarter, and to receive board, lodging, and washing. Such Nurses to provide their own uniform to be approved by the Superintendent of Nurses.

7.—All Nurses will be under the direct control of the House Surgeon, and the Superintendent of Nurses, and will be subject to such Rules of the Infirmary as may be in force from time to time.

8.—Each Nurse or Probationer is to keep the apartment allotted to her use neat, clean, and in proper order.
