## HOSPITAL MEDAL COMES HOME AFTER 87 YEARS

A MEDAL given to a nurse at Kettering General Hospital in 1917 has been returned to the Trust 87 years later.

Miss ER Wilshere sent the medal and a photograph of her late aunt, Olive Wilshere, to the Trust as a historical keepsake.

Olive received the medal, given to mark her qualification as a nurse, in 1917, after three years training in the then Kettering and District Hospital.

She was born in Leicestershire, the fourth child of a family of six, and spent most of her life in Kirby Muxloe, a village west of Leicester.

On completing her training at Kettering she moved to Ashbourne Cottage Hospital in Derbyshire and later became

a member of the Leicester branch of the Royal College of Nursing and later a governor of Leicester Royal Infirmary.

In World War Two she was a volunteer in the Kirby First Aid Post and was on duty when two landmines were dropped on the village in 1940. She died of cancer in 1945.
