ruled today that the 1965 constitution introduced at the time of Rhodesia's declaration of independence—and the present Government set up under it—were not lawful.

But the two judges ruled at the same time that the regime of Mr. Ian Smith was the only effective Government of the country.

The judges were giving reserved judgment on a constitutional test case hearing in which the legality of the Government and the constitution were challenged.

Two men—a white lawyer and an African nationalist—had applied for release from detention on the grounds that the emergency regulations under which they were detained were illegal and unconstitutional.
