

A record entry of 2,217 at Kettering cage bird show

THE 16 judges at tomorrow's Kettering and District Cage Bird Society's Show will have their work cut out to deal with a mammoth entry of birds.

The total entry of 2,217 birds of all varieties and sizes, make this a record entry for the show.

Judges are drawn from as far apart as Edinburgh, Stoke on Trent, and London.

The birds will continue arriving tonight, and early tomorrow morning, in preparation for the staging of the show later in the morning.

For the bird fashion watch, this year's canaries come in three main sizes, the large bird of the breed, the very slender Yorkshire Canary and of the popular "We Gem" Border canary (the smallest of the breed).


